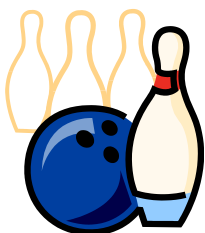

Due to the large amount of carbon monoxide poisonings from generators, the North Naples Fire Control and Rescue District is notifying you of a potential death risk related to the use of your generator. The exhaust from portable generators produces a by-product that is colorless and **odorless**.

READ OWNER'S MANUAL PRIOR TO USE

Generator Placement

Place a minimum of 15 feet from any opening such as windows, patio doors, and open garage doors.

Ensure the wind is not blowing generator fumes towards any open windows. Be cautious of blowing gas fumes toward your neighbors open windows and thus creating a hazardous situation for them.

Turn off generator before re-fueling and allow the generator to cool before re-fueling.

Use the proper size electrical cords with no cuts or frays. Do not pinch the cords in doors or windows.

Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

1. Headache	8. Difficulty in coordinating
2. Dizziness	9. Difficulty in breathing
3. Irritability	10. Chest Pain
4. Confusion/Memory Loss	11. Cerebral Edema
5. Nausea and vomiting	12. Convulsions/Seizures
6. Disorientation	13. Coma
7. Abnormal reflexes	14. Death

TREATMENT

1. Go to a safe area that is not affected by fumes and contact **911 immediately**.
2. Wait for assistance.
3. **DO NOT RE-ENTER AFFECTED AREA.**

MAKE SURE ALL COOKING APPIANCES ARE TURNED OFF & CLEAR OF COMBUSTIBLES. ALSO, DO NOT PLACE YOUR GENERATOR IN YOUR GARAGE OR ON YOUR PORCH/PATIO.



Town Manager's Report



Ah, those Hot August Nights! Summer is in full swing and it is Hot and Humid! When the temp goes up so do our expenses. Please make sure the last one out of the Town Hall after playing cards or any other function sets the thermostat back to 76 and cuts off the lights. Remember, every penny we can save in energy saves money for you.

Fortunately, the summer rains have finally begun giving our very dry landscape some much needed relief. With the rains back in the forecast, we can now start moving forward with some of our landscaping projects that have been on hold. Here's what to look for:

Landscaping: Sod – As you may have noticed, we had many dead spots pop-up throughout the lawns. This was caused by limitation of only being able to water 2 times per week and our aging irrigation system not being able to keep up through the severe drought we just went through. Starting the second week in August, we will be going throughout the Association replacing these dead sections with new sod. If you have a problem in your yard and want to make sure you are on the list, please give us a call in the office.

Plant replacements – From now until late October we will be continuing with any plant replacements the Landscape Committee has recommended from its bi-monthly tours. If you have been promised a plant replacement, it should be completed very soon. If you have questions, please call the office for the scheduling.

Lakes: You may have noticed some work going on in your back yard along the lake. We are repairing the lake banks that have eroded due to wash out caused by the past rains. The black cloth you see covering the area is an erosion cloth that will prevent future erosion. Over time, the clothes black color will fade and match the natural color of the existing bank.

Another positive aesthetic attribute from the rains is that our lakes water levels have risen. So far the algae problem that we had last year has been kept under control. To make sure our water stays clear and to assure the health and longevity of our lakes, we are taking monthly water samples and other various tests to be proactive and ready for any problems that may occur.

Important Information: Before you get a violation notice, please follow the rules. **Top violations in Village Walk:** trash cans being stored outside and visible from street/ neighboring homes; dirty homes, driveways and roofs; parking for more than 4 hrs on the street and parking vehicles outside that are not allowed, such as trucks and commercial vans. Please save us the unnecessary steps of having to send you a violation letter or worse, having the association resort to legal means to have the violation corrected.

The sooner we know about a problem the faster we can get it resolved. Whether it is landscaping or anything else, please contact the office.

Remember, we're here to help in anyway we can. Just give us a call in the office.

ACC: All EXTERIOR changes to your home must be approved by the ACC prior to making the change. The ACC meets the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 3pm, upstairs in the Town Hall. Your application must be submitted to the VW Office no later than Tuesday, Noon.

Pets: All pets must be on a leash at all times; please pick up after your pets.



Chemicals: Please dispose of chemicals the proper way. Don't throw waste in the lakes or on lawns as these are hazardous for the ground and eventually run off into our lakes, which cause bacteria.



Speeding: Speed LIMIT is 25mph.

Trash Cans: Trash cans may not be put out any earlier than 6pm the night before trash day. Please store your cans inside or out of sight from the street and/or your neighbors view.



Post Office Box Locks and Keys: If you lose your keys to the mail box, you will need to call a locksmith; you will need a new lock and keys.

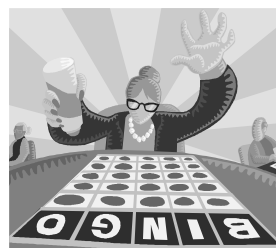

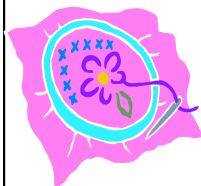
