May 19, 2011 Board Highlights

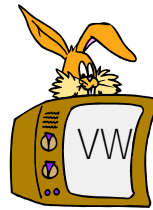
2011/2012 Budget for Village Walk was unanimously approved by the Board. Quarterly Maintenance Fee for the budget will be as follows:

- ◆ Capri and Regent Models - \$755.00
- ◆ Glenwood and Oakmont Models - \$785.00
- ◆ Manor and Winsor Models - \$831.00

Board voted unanimously to allocate another \$20,000 for the uncollectible assessments reserve.

Town Manager's Report



Can you believe we have reached the halfway point of 2011? June is a great month for many reasons. From a kids perspective, summer vacation! It is also the beginning of the rainy season giving our landscaping some much needed water and raising our lakes to the desired levels. However, June also brings the start of the Hurricane Season. Though we are hopeful no hurricanes will come our way, we should nonetheless be prepared. For helpful hints and a safety checklist stop by the Town Hall Office for a copy or visit <http://www.redcross.org/www-files/Documents/pdf/Preparedness/checklists/Hurricane.pdf>.

We have procedures in place if a hurricane/storm is forecasted our way. All storm drains on the streets should be marked with stakes and kept clear of debris at all times. If water starts to rise in the streets due to blocked storm drains, the stakes mark where the drains are so the debris can be cleared to allow drainage.

Landscaping:

- ◆ Rain has been in very short supply so far this year. Because of the drought, we have to make many adjustments/additions to our irrigation to compensate, especially for our grass. However, we **are still limited to only twice a week watering as mandated by the County. Let's hope the rains start soon.**
- ◆ Trimming of the Palms will begin the first of June. The purpose of this trimming is to remove all the dead fronds and seed pods. However, if the fronds are green and not touching any structure, we plan to leave them on for the health of the palms.
- ◆ Once the rains start, we plan to continue with needed plantings and sod replacements throughout the association.

Cable: Remember this is the last month that you will be provided cable through your maintenance fees. Starting July 1, each homeowner will be individually responsible for obtaining cable. You should have received by now a cable survey. So far 480 residents have already turned in the surveys. Thank You! However, we still need another 370 who have not responded. This survey will provide us vital information in the decision making process as we negotiate a new cable contract that will be best for you and the community. Please turn your survey in as soon as possible and if you have any questions on this important issue, please contact us.

Other Important Information: Please do your part in keeping Village Walk beautiful. Keep your home and driveways clean throughout the year. Save us the unnecessary steps of having to send you a violation letter or worse having the association complete the necessary cleaning and billing you, the homeowner.

Remember to follow the posted speed limit of 25 MPH in Village Walk and stop at all Stop Signs. We **have very active residents who love to bike and/or walk. Let's keep everyone safe. Thank you for all your support in making VW the best place to live.** Please remember that the staff is here to help you in any way we can.

DISASTER PLANNING FAMILY AFFAIR

There is no substitute for having a family plan in event of a hurricane.

Will you evacuate, and if you do where will you go? Is your insurance up to date?

Have you made accommodations for your pets? Are your prescription medicines filled?

Is your home secure?

These are just some of the bits of information you need to now in preparation for a storm.

DISCUSS the type of hazards that could affect your family.

KNOW **your home's vulnerability to the storm's danger.**

PLAN for your pets.

DISCUSS an evacuation route and destination.

OUTLINE an alternate plan as backup.

KEEP your insurance policies in a safe, dry place.

PREPARE a disaster supply kit

TERMS YOU WILL HEAR THROUGHOUT THE HURRICANE SEASON

*EYE-The relatively calm area in the center of a hurricane. It can range from 5 to more than 50 miles wide.

*EYE WALL-A doughnut-shaped zone of the highest winds and heavy rain surrounding the eye.

*FEEDER BANDS-The bands of thunderstorms that spiral into and around the center of a tropical system. A typical storm may have three or more bands moving in advance of the main rain shield, usually 40 to 80 miles apart.

*HURRICANE WARNING-Issued when hurricane conditions -winds of 74 mph or greater are expected in 24 hrs.

*HURRICANE WATCH-Issued when hurricane conditions are possible within 36 hours.

*LANDFALL-When the surface center of a tropical cyclone intersects with the coastline.

*MAJOR HURRICANE-A storm with highest winds of 111 mph or higher.

*TROPICAL DISBURBANCE-An area of thunderstorms that keep its identify for at least 24 hrs.

*TROPICAL STORM-A warm-centered, low-pressure circulation with highest sustained winds between 39 & 73 mph/

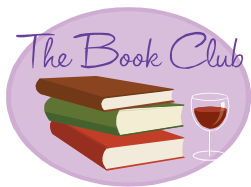
*WIND SHEAR-Upper level winds that can blow the tops off hurricanes, weakening or destroying them.

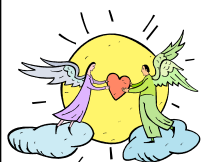

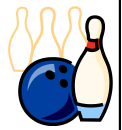

It is essential to take the necessary precautions while exercising during the summer months. The average person can take from one to two weeks to adapt to warmer, more humid temperatures. Here are some helpful safety tips to follow while exercising during the summer:

Rehydrate your body. While exercising in hot weather you can easily lose up to a quart of water an hour. Drink water before, during and after exercising. Since your body can only absorb 8 ounces of cold water every 20 minutes, continue to drink fluids even after you no longer feel thirsty.

Avoid working out during peak hours. Very hot and humid weather hampers perspiration's ability to cool your body. Try exercising in the morning or evening to avoid the most intense heat.

Try walking. Walking is considered the most popular exercise among Americans.

Cool off in the water. Swimming is an excellent way to exercise during the summer months.

Don't forget your sunscreen. Apply SPF 15 sunscreen at least 30 minutes before exercising outdoors.

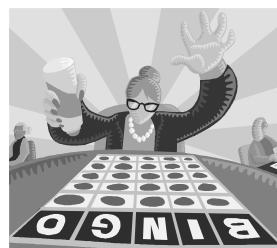

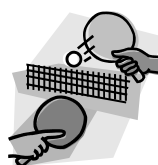
